The condition of this aforesaid obligation is such that whereas the aforesaid Sonnet Dickinson taken by
virtue of an execution to pursue to Sam Wotton of the County of Somerset one of his goods & chattels of
John Lydiat dec. for the purchase of one thousand three hundred pounds of good sweet fat necks of Pork of
the hundred pounds of good a certain Debt recovered in the Probivall Court as also the sum of six
hundred twenty seven pounds of tobacco charges arriving in the said suit which by computation amounteth
to the sum of three thousand three hundred and fifty five pounds of tobacco now if the said Sonnet Dickinson here
have kept harmless and indemnified from time to time and at all times him the said William Whittington
and from all troubles and imbrances which shall or may come to him the said William Whittington his
heirs & assigns or shall when the same required surrender up his the said bond for the said Dickinson body
as a prisoner for the non payment or compliance with the execution and pay the said Wm Whittington
the sum of two hundred seventy eight pounds of tobacco for and for doing the said execution all which
being well and truly performed then the obligation to be void or else to remain a bond to be in full force power
