 from one Katherine Overenden dated at Deal December the 14th and 18th Ann^o 1695 likewise
 the said Katherine Overenden did also prefer her answer to the a^d Letters, and humbly prayed
 bearing of the same wth order was read as followeth
 Cyprian Overenden Deal December the 18-1695/

I am glad to hear you were living when you wrote my Cousin Thomas Ringo's letter but sorry
 you should omit dating your Letter I have rec^d but one Letter from you since I left Canterbury
 which is near ten year and a half since your last directed to me at w^{ch} where I soon received
 it I hearing you were gone to em^g the Island and you and your husband both drowned in going
 and you not writing to me in so many years made me much question whether you were dead
 or not I bless god I am well in health but Lame of my Limb I have lived ever since I left
 Canterbury with my Cousin Jack who was your old Companion Elizabeth Parke who now lives
 at Deal at the north end of the Town near the two Brewers I have been very kind to your Son
 George and he very kindly requits me for the help I do my Estate that should come to you
 after my death and I do m^{ch} thanky as your sole heir I should saying you dyed Just lately
 and he hath been with my Cousin's husband to advise him to sue me as well as himself I have
 ago George hath begun his suit a bore this year & quarter and shall hold on, I thank the Lord
 my Cousin Jack and her Children are very kind to me and careful in my business or other
 might go very hard with me they do likewise stand up for you & Katherine's good Children
