Wherefore know all men by these presents that I John Popbwell of the County of Dorset in the Province of Devonshire and firmly bounden unto Francis Jenckins of the County aforesaid the full and just sum or quantity of four hundred and fifteen pounds of good sound bright large Merchantable tobacco in value to be paid upon demand at some one town or port in the colony of Virginia in the County aforesaid for a valuable consideration in hand already received to the said Francis performed and to be performed by me the said John Popbwell his heirs executors or assigns or lawful attorney in writing whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 28 day of May anno Domini 1660

And the Defendant in his proper person came into court and confessed the debt in the Declaration above mentioned to be just and true the same is confirmed by the Court here that the said John Popbwell Francis Jenckins and recover against the Defendant as well the sum of four hundred and fifteen pounds of good sound bright large Merchantable tobacco in value in the Declaration mentioned as also the sum of pounds of tobacco for his cost of suit in his behalf laid out and expended and the cost in moneys

To the Petitioner's Honor Justice of the Peace for the County of Dorset now sitting the Petition of Stephen White most humbly sheweth
That your Petitioner being now eighteen years of age doth therefore most humbly pray Liberty to have his Guardian and co in duty bound that pray
And a better Petition being granted by the Court the said White the same day made Oath of in Obedience which was allowed by the Court Defended by D Doul

Edmund Howard of the County of Dorset Robert Tools was attached to answer unto Edmund Howard gent of a Debt that he rendered unto him the full sum of five pounds two shillings and three pence of lawful current money of England which from him he unjustly detraeth and whereupon the said Edmund by Sam: Worthington his attorney Complaineth that the said Robert on the second day of March in the year of our Lord 1665 at Gocomote within the Jurisdiction of this Court by his certain Bill Obligatory which the said Edmund signed and sealed with the seals of the said Robert here King of the said Court the date hereof is the day and year aforesaid wherein the said Robert became Indebted unto the said Edmund in the full sum of five pounds two shillings and three pence of lawful current money of England nevertheless the said Robert according to the tenor of his said Bill the said sum of money to the said Edmund hath not paid to the damage of the said Edmund of the sum of five pounds and thereupon he bringeth his suit here
