 for the debt of one Thomas Manlove late of this County and the said John to the said Deigue faithfully
 promising in manner and being indebted in assumption upon himself and to the said Deigue faithfully
 promising that he the said John the same to the said Deigue would well & truly perform & pay nevertheless
 the said John the said sum of Seven thousand two hundred pounds of Tobacco to the said Deigue hath not
 paid to the damage of the said Deigue of 9000 pounds of Tobacco and thereof he prayeth redress
 Witness our hands at Poconoke the 10th day of June 1698

Know all men by these presents that we Edward Wheler and Sam^l Washington both of the County of Probins-
and and fully bounden unto Thomas manlove of and in the County of Suffex in the Territorie
of Virginia in the full sum or quantity of twenty seven thousand pounds of good sound merchantable
Tobacco in Cusne to be paid paid at some convenient sending in some port town and within the terme
or space of or two and twenty months from the date of these presents to the true payment of which said
Tobacco to be paid within the same and we do bind us our heirs and either of our
heirs Exors or admors jointly and severally for the whole and in the whole unto the said manlove the
heirs Exors or admors jointly by these advertising our hands and seals the 21st day of Janry 1692³

The condition of the obligation is such that if the above named Edward or Samuel do for their
selves or their heirs &c. &c. pay unto the above said Thomas his heirs &c. the just sum of fourteen
pounds & ten shillings and six pence of lawful money of Great Britain within the time & to the
then the obligation to be void and of no effect or else to be and remain in full force & strength &
binding.
