

It is now lawfully made by the public authority of Jonathan Buckler of Kent County in the territories of Pennsylvania does owe and stand justly indebted unto Thomas Bedwell of y^e County and territories aforesaid the sum of five hundred and twenty pounds of the present money of the Government due to be paid on or before the last day of November next ensuing the date hereof on some convenient landing place on Dover River or Little Creek and for the true payment whereof he does bind my self my heirs Executors and assigns him the said Thomas Bedwell the said £520 or assigns or lawfull attorney firmly by these presents as witness my hand and seal this 12th day of June 1695

Thomas John Spencer and Thomas Shonson before me John Brinckles one of the Justices of the Peace for the County of Kent in the Province of Pennsylvania and sworn upon the holy Evangelist that they saw Jonathan Buckler sign and deliver the within Bill unto the said Thomas Bedwell as witness my hand County Clerk John Brinckles

And the defendant in his proper person came into Court confessed the Debt in the Declaration within mentioned to be just and true and it is ordered by the Court here that the said Thomas Bedwell recover against the Defendant as well the sum of five hundred and twenty pounds of the present money of Pennsylvania in the Declaration mentioned as also the sum of pounds of tobacco for the cost of suit in his behalf and out of expenses and the cost in money

Somerset County to Richard Cull Sen^r John Cull Sen^r was attached to answer unto Elizabeth Willgoose Spinster of a plea of trespass on the case and whereupon the said Elizabeth by Edward Jones her attorney complains that whereas the said Richard the 10th day of June in the year of our Lord 1696 at Doxwode within the jurisdiction of the Court in consideration that the said Elizabeth would serve with him the said Richard in any such service as he the said Richard should employ her in that then he the said Richard would give to her the said Elizabeth so much tobacco as she would reasonably deserve for the same service and the said Elizabeth in fact saith that she hath served with the said Richard from the 1st day of June to the last day of October then next following which is the full term of four months for which she further in fact saith she doth deserve for the same the sum of four hundred pounds of tobacco nevertheless the said Richard the said sum of four hundred pounds of tobacco or any part thereof to the said Elizabeth hath not paid but hath her words denied and doth still deny to the damage of the said Elizabeth of 800 pounds of tobacco and more of the which her suit the Jones of 1696 vs John Cull Sen^r Richard Cull
