 part and John Bratton on the other Part Witnesseth that the said Peter Lord doth freely & volun-
 tarily bind himself a servant to the said John Bratton or his heirs for the full term of years of
 two years that is to say from the 25 day of 9th in the year of God 1696 till the 25 day of
 9th in the year of God 1698 for a due consideration in hand already paid and the said Peter
 is to serve the said John Bratton or his heirs in any manner of service that the said John or
 his heirs shall employ him in during the said time, and the said John Bratton doth oblige himself
 or his heirs to find and allow the said Peter Lord sufficient dyett washing & lodging with all other
 necessaries during the said time, And in Witness whereof we have hereunto set our hands & seals
 day and year above written
