Walter Taylor Df. Richard Tull of this County Jurisdiction was attached to answer unto James Atkinson Esq. of a plea of debt due and whereupon the sd James of him Sam Worthington his Attorney saith that on the 21<sup>st</sup> day of August in the year of our Lord 1695 the sd Richard at Pocoms within the Jurisdiction of this Court by a Certain Writing under the hand & seal of him the sd Richard bearing date the day & year aforesaid, whereon he did acknowledge himself to be indebted unto the said James in the just sum of six hundred pounds of good sound Merchantable leaf Tobacco in Casks Contentment in Pocoms Liberty at or upon the 10 day of October next ensuing the date of this aforesaid Bill. Whereby the sd Richard to the said James in a sum of Tobacco according to the tenor of the sd Bill hath not paid to the damage of the sd James of Twelve hundred pounds of Tobacco and thereupon he brings this Bill. This Bill binds the said Richard Tull of Maryland County in the Province of Maryland my Lord Executor or Assignee to pay or cause to be paid unto James Atkinson Esq. of the said County within his Lord's Executor or Assignee the full & just sum of six hundred pounds of good sound Merchantable leaf Tobacco in Casks Contentment on Pocoms Liberty at or upon the 10 day of October day of ensuing the date hereof and without my hand & seal this 21<sup>st</sup> day of August 1695.
