Proposed that an Ordinance pass, to oblige the Justices of the several County Courts to sit in Court twelve hours in dinner and eight in winter every day (otherwise to be paid accordingly) and that the certain sum and of their Complying therewith of such Justices are lawful and sufficient and that they concur therein unless upon Extraordinary Occasion.

The white booy said his Ex: was pleased to say that he hoped the Commission would for his Master Justice and their own Ex: duly oblige to comply with this proposal and doth Order by advice in Council had it is known by Proprio, that his Ex: & his said Council pass an Exceau of two Justices sitting from time to time to be returned into his Ex: at the Port of Minneapolis, together with Copy of his County Letters there Expressing the reason of every Petition or writ allowed.

Then was Read an Order Concerning Marriages, and another for Closing publick Places

By His Ex: & Govr: & Council July 17: 1696.

Vpon Complaint by several Persons made, of the very great abuse done to the County through Constables receiving & negligente in taking the list of Taxable. Ordered that the Sheriff give Notice to the Justices of the several Courts in August next, that they issue strict Order & Charge forthwith to the Constables of each hundred within their respective Courts thereby commanding them to go to every individual house of the said hundreds in which they officials shall demand & take an acco^rd^t from the Master Wiffrs or Dauns of every house in writing under Sigs of Master Wiffrs or Dauns own hand, what Number of Taxable they have, where to list taken, they are to close seal up (after Copy thereof made for the County Court) and return the same unto his Ex: at the Port of Minneapolis by the 16th day of September (if the Assembly then sitteth) - Otherwise by the first day of the next Provincial Court under pain of being prosecuted to the full severity of the law for contumacy.

In aforesd Order being so, it was Ordered by the Govr: that Orders pursuant to the aforesd Order do forthwith issue to all Constables. Which order is as follows:

By virtue of an Order from his Ex: dated July 17: 1696. Was doth by Order Strictly charge Command that the Constables of each hundred within their respective Courts, to go to every individual house of the said hundreds in which they officials, and shall demand that an acco^rd^t from the Master Wiffrs or Dauns own hand what Number of Taxable they have, where to list when taken they are to close seal up after Copy thereof made for the County Court and bring with the same unto his Ex: at the Port of Minneapolis by the 16th day of September (if the Assembly then sitteth) otherwise by the first day of the next Provincial Court under pain of being prosecuted to the full severity of the law for contumacy.
