 pay in well & truly to be made: we bind us & our heirs & assigns of us, our heirs & assigns & our joint
 or severally in the whole & for the whole finally by these presents. In Witness whereof we fix our
 hands & seals this seventeenth day of July in the eighth year of the reign of our Sovereign Lord William
 the third King of Great Britain & Ireland & of France & of the faith etc. Anno Domini 1696.

The Condition of this obligation is such that if the said James Knox be of his good abovance to all the
 Masters Justices of the Peace especially unto Anne & Co. and do make his personal appearance before our
 Justices of our next County Court to be holden the second Tuesday of August next ensuing the date at the
 holding Court, and then & there to answer what shall be alleged or objected against him on this Matter & that
 and stand & abide the award thereof that then this obligation to be void & of no effect or else to stand
 remain and be, in full force power & virtue etc.
