

And the Defendant by Peter Dent his Attorney defends the said Defendant for the said Plaintiff that he is not chargeable for the said Execution, for that he has said upon full satisfaction of Hannah May ward the said Plaintiff in Execution by the delivery of Satorall Debt, and thus he prays may be Enquired of by the Court. *Done 2^d of July*

And the Plaintiff saith that the Defendant is chargeable for the whole Debt expressed in the Copy and had her in Execution for the said Debt and of that she prays herself on the Court also. *Done 2^d of July*

The Declaration upon this being read the Court found & sworn, the whole matter being left to the judgment of the Justices of this Court, who having deliberated of this & inquired in hand. Do Order as it is hereby ordered, that the Plaintiff recover of the Defendant nine pounds Sterling or the Value thereof in pieces of eight & four shillings & six pence & pieces with Copy of Subscribed Decree. //

At the Special Instance & request of Mr. Elias Coleman in open Court this day was read all manner of persons within the Liberties whatsoever in any manner of buying selling bartering or otherwise trading or conveying with Samaras my now Wife at her peril. For so much as she by order & promise that I will not be responsible to any debt or debts done by her, nor will I pay any debt or debts by her contracted from hence forward from hence forward as witness my hand this 13th day of August anno Domini 1696. Elias Coleman.

The aforesaid paper or instrument (after the Copy of the Court had made thereof) was read by order of Mr. Elias Coleman, who requested the same might be recorded.

King Danish with his great men or Subjects, and the Englishmen appointed (and excepted) this day appeared before the War. Court, in order to make Report. In Evidence whereunto, do Exhibit the following lines

Survey of County of...
Whereas by virtue of an order of Court bearing date June 7th and 11th 1696. that was subscribed not only chosen by the Court but also by King Danish and his great Men, to go & make inspection into the bounds of a certain piece of Land formerly granted by the Lord of Ballsbridge unto the said King Danish and his Indians, in pursuance of whose Order, was subscribed did go with the said King Danish & his Indians and run the former bounds & with the same Compass and Instrument Cooper who was then Surveyor of the aforesaid County did lay it out and was found the first boundary of the said Land was decayed and down, and was did mark a White Oak about twenty or thirty foot distant from the aforesaid boundary, and so proceeded & marked the old Line Cross for four miles Northward from the first boundary. In so much that the Indians was very well satisfied, but might coming on the Indians would go no further, but appointed a meeting on 25th of July in order to which was met, and some other Indians meeting with them they had a Court and upon their result would go no further with us than before, this given under our hands & Seals this thirteenth day of August anno Domini 1696. *Rowland Beabins Seal R B his mark. Robert Smith R Smith his mark. Rowland Beabins Junr.*

Elizabeth Houson made oath this day in open Court that she attended on behalf of James Dobury against James Rowley these days & humbly prays order for the same which to her was granted. //

Mary Hillpott this day made oath that she attended these days as evidence for James Dobury against James Rowley & humbly prays order for the same, which to her was granted. // Court adjourned till tomorrow at 8 o'clock
