Upon the Hon<sup>ble</sup> David Brown employed one Richard Underwood to carry him & the aforesaid drumb to his own house. After which the said Brown did send a short Note to this Court thereby importing that the Drumb he the said might be for four hundred pound of tobacco for the employ or service done afo. which Note by Underwood assigned over to one Wm White who exhibited the same to our said Court, whose judgment was, that the hundred pounds of tobacco might be sufficient for the employ or service aforesaid.
