 found, & did Joseph afford Security for his said Wife for in this Case expended in the sum of five pound
 sterling, due to be levied on his goods & in which was of Court accepted.

 the Evidence therein being fairly examined, was by the Wor. Court debated & dismissed
 in Reason and Justice & in Order not on by all.
