The blanks in said bill were filled up with the words " thirty " and " five. "

Mr. Forwood then moved to lay the said bill on the table, and that it be printed ;

On the question being put,

It was determined in the negative.

The question then recurred on the passage of said bill,

And on being put,

It was determined in the affirmative.

On motion of Mr. Culbreth,

The house took up the bill entitled, an act to continue in force the acts of Assembly which would expire with the present session of the General Assembly ;

Read the second time by special order and will pass ;

And the bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to provide for the election of the levy court of Caroline county by the people, passed at December session 1839, ch. 72 ;

Read the second time by special order ;

On the question being put,

Shall the said bill pass ?

On motion of Mr. Nicols of Caroline,
