

Mr. Darby presented the petition of sundry citizens of Montgomery county, praying an alteration in the law providing for fencing of public roads in said county ;

Read and referred to Messrs. Darby, Braddock, Gott and Gittings.

On motion of Mr. Risteau,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Risteau, Randall, Poultney, Hook and Walker, to bring in a bill for the relief of the heirs of James Power of Baltimore county.

On motion of Mr. Spencer,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Spencer, Hammond and Tuck, to bring in a bill supplemental to an act entitled, an act respecting the equity jurisdiction in the county courts.

On motion of Mr. Spencer,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Spencer, Braddock and Stone, to bring in a bill supplemental to an act entitled, an act for amending and reducing into system, the laws and regulations concerning last wills and testaments, the duties of executors, administrators and guardians, and the rights of orphans and other representatives of deceased persons, passed at November session 1798, chapter 101.

On motion of Mr. Dorsey,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Dorsey, Sellman, Owens of Anne Arundel, and Hammond, to bring in a bill to provide for the more effectual payment of all monies collected by the several officers of Anne Arundel county and Howard district in said county.

On motion of Mr. Stone,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Stone, Handy, Boggs and Dashiell, to bring in a bill, giving jurisdiction to Somerset county court, concurrent with the magistrates' court of said county, in certain cases.

On motion of Mr. Bouldin,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Bouldin, Sutton, Hope and Johns to bring in a bill to allow Carvil H. Prigg, late collector of taxes in the third election district of Harford county, further time to complete his collections.

On motion of Mr. Sutton of Kent,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Sutton of Kent, J. H. Gale and Rasia M. Gale, to bring in a bill to repeal the magistrates' courts, and to extend single magistrate's jurisdiction in Kent county.

Mr. Lowe submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Adjutant General of this State, be and he is hereby required to furnish to the order of Captain George W. Sherwood of the "Easton Guards," forty glazed knapsacks, by his giving satisfactory security for their safe keeping and return;
