

Sec. 4. And be it enacted, That for good cause shown, and as the interest of the creditors of said bank may require, the said county court, or in vacation thereof, the judge as aforesaid, shall have full power to remove all, or either, of said trustees, and appoint one or more persons in their place; and the annual compensation of said trustees while acting in the execution of said trust, shall be fixed and determined by said county court, having due regard to the interest of the creditors of said bank; which compensation shall be paid out of the fund of said trust, and shall be independent of all charges for clerk hire and other necessary and incidental expenses, considered proper in the opinion of said county court.

Sec. 5. And be it enacted, That the trustees to be appointed by virtue of the provisions of this act, may recover any debt or damages due to the bank, in a suit to be instituted in the corporate name or style of the institution.
