Richard Lilly, of the Independent Blues of the city of Baltimore, one hundred muskets, cartouch boxes, belts and bayonets each, with scabbards to match, on condition of the said Capt. Richard Lilly, giving sufficient security for the safe keeping and return of the same; and provided, that the said Lilly return to the State of Maryland, to the proper authorities, the muskets they now have in use in said company.
