Mr. Crain submitted the following message:

*By the House of Delegates,
January 29th, 1842.*

Gentlemen of the Senate:

We propose with the concurrence of your honorable body, to appoint a joint committee in pursuance of resolution No. 8, passed December session 1840, and we have appointed Messrs. Crain and Graves as the committee on the part of this House, to unite with a gentleman to be selected by your honorable body.

Which was read, assented to and sent to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Nicols of Dorchester,

The house was called and the door-keeper sent after the absent members.

On motion of Mr. Hammond,

The house proceeded with the ordinary business of the session in the absence of the doorkeeper.

On motion of Mr. Hammond,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Hammond, Dorsey and Sellman to bring a bill entitled, an act relating to sheriff's and collector's bonds.

On motion of Mr. Grove,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Grove, Hollman, Lyday and Spencer to bring in a bill regulating certain fees of the sheriff of Washington county;

And to the same committee to bring in a bill relative to the school fund of Washington county.

Mr. Boyle presented certain resolutions adopted by a meeting of certain citizens of Carroll county upon the subjects of retrenchment and the currency;
