

Mr. Buskirk reported a bill entitled, an act to quiet titles to real estate in the town of Frostburg in Allegany county and for other purposes ;

Read the first and by special order the second time, passed, and sent to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Tuck,

The House took up the bill entitled, a supplement to the act to change the investment of the school fund of Prince George's county, passed December session 1839, chapter 297 ;

Read the second time by special order, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Gott reported a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of O. Gray of Montgomery county ;

Read the first and by special order the second time, passed, and sent to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Crain,

Ordered, That John S. Gittings, commissioner of loans, report to this House, what amount of bonds, certificates or other evidence of indebtedness of the State of Maryland are in his possession and have been satisfied.

Mr. Hammond reported a bill entitled, an act relating to sheriffs and collector's bonds ;

Read the first time and referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.

Mr. Dorsey reported a bill entitled, an act to provide for the payment of the county tax in Anne Arundel county and Howard District of Anne Arundel county ;

Read the first and by special order the second time, passed, and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Lowe reported a bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to erect a town in Talbot county, by the name of Saint Michaels and to appoint commissioners ;

Read the first and by special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

The House then took up the bill entitled, a supplement to an act for the benefit of the children of James Power of the city of Baltimore, passed February 1840, chapter 181 ;

On motion of Mr. Graves,

Ordered, That the said bill be recommitted to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.

The House then took up the bill from the Senate entitled, an act to give to the Chancellor and the county courts as courts of equity, jurisdiction in cases of divorce ;

On motion of Mr. Tuck,

Ordered, That said bill be made the order of the day for Wednesday next.

The doorkeeper returned and reported that he had notified the absent members that their attendance was required in the House.
