

Will the House accept the said substitute?

It was determined in the affirmative.

The question then recurred on the passage of the said bill;

And on being put,

It was passed and sent to the Senate.

The Speaker laid before House the report of the trustees of the Brookville Academy in Montgomery;

Read and referred to the committee on Education.

Mr. Darby presented the petition of sundry citizens of Montgomery county and of Howard District in Anne Arundel county, praying that a law may pass authorising a change in the site of the bridge over the Patuxent river, known as Snell's Bridge, and to move the location of the public road to correspond with said change;

Read and referred to Messrs. Darby, Hammond and Gittings.

Mr. Braddock presented the report of the managers of the school fund for the fourth election district of Montgomery county;

Read and referred to the committee on Education.

Mr. Stone presented the petition of Thomas Phœbus and others, praying that a law may be passed condemning a landing called Stump Landing, on St. Peter's creek, in Somerset county, for the purpose of making it a public landing;

Read and referred to Messrs. Stone, Handy, Dashiell and Boggs.

On motion of Mr. Nicols of Dorchester,

Ordered, That his Excellency the Governor be requested to furnish this House with information as to the amount expended by virtue of resolution number thirty, of December session 1832, with the items of charge and the names of persons paid, and with whom the contract, if any, was made in pursuance of that resolution.

On motion of Mr. Johnson,

Leave was granted to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice to bring in a bill affecting the jurisdiction of the Court of Chancery and the county courts as courts of equity, and the mode and the time in which objections to the jurisdiction shall be taken.

Mr. Johnson, from the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, to which was referred the bill from the Senate entitled, an act to authorise the trusts therein mentioned, reported unfavorably thereon;

Read the first time and laid on the table.

Mr. Pressman, chairman of the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, reported a bill entitled, an additional supplement to an act entitled, an act directing the manner of suing out attachments in this province and limiting the extent of them;

Read the first time, and

Ordered to be printed.
