

Insert the word "hold" after the words "to have" in the eighth line of the third section.

Insert the following section :

"Section 8. And be it enacted, That it shall not be lawful for the said Cumberland and Somerset Turnpike Road Company to occupy or use any portion of the lands that may be necessary for the accommodation of the works of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company, or for the main route of the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road, or that may be within the limits of either of the public roads there now existing, except to cross these roads, without injuring the same."

Insert the following :

"Section 9. And be it enacted, That nothing in this act be construed so as to authorise the said corporation to issue any note, token, device, scrip or other evidence of debt, to be used as currency."

"Section 10. And be it enacted, That this act of incorporation shall enure for thirty years from its passage, and that the Legislature reserves to itself the right to alter or annul this act of incorporation at pleasure."

Which were read, concurred in, and the bill as amended, read the second time by special order, and will pass.

The rule being suspended,

Mr. Gallagher presented the memorial of John Highan, Patrick McKanna and others, creditors of the Annapolis and Elk Ridge Rail Road Company;

Read and referred to the select committee already raised on that subject.

Mr. Buskirk presented the petition of the Boston and New York Coal Company, praying an amendment of their charter;

Read and referred to the committee on Internal Improvement.

On motion of Mr. Dorsey,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Dorsey, Selman, Owens of Anne Arundel and Hammond, to introduce a bill for the relief of Geo. Ellicott of Howard District of Anne Arundel county.

Mr. Hope presented the petition of John S. Williams, John Y. Day and others, citizens of Harford and Baltimore counties, praying the passage of an act therein mentioned;

Read and referred to Messrs. Hope, Poultney, Bouldin, Risteau, Randall, Sutton of Harford, Walker, Hook and Johns.

Mr. Johns, chairman of the committee on Divorees, reported a bill entitled, an act to divorce Eliza A. Clark of Frederick county, from her husband Samuel C. Clark, a vinculo matrimonii;

Read the first and by special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Forman reported a bill entitled, an act to authorise the voters of Worcester county, to signify, whether they are in favor of or opposed to the total prohibition of the sale of intoxicating liquors;

Read the first and by special order the second time and rejected.
