Also, from the same committee, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to abolish the office of armorer at Frederick town, and at the city of Annapolis, reported the same with the following amendments:

Strike out the first, second, third and fourth sections, and insert, Section 1. That the offices of armorer at Annapolis and Frederick-town, be and they are hereby abolished and discontinued, and all laws and resolutions, in any way inconsistent with this

section, be and they are hereby repealed.

Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That the Governor of this State, is hereby authorised and requested to cause to be removed to Annapolis, all arms and public property of every discription now in the armory or under the care of the armorer at Frederick-town, and to place the same under the care of the Adjutant General, who is hereby directed to take charge of the same, and also, of all arms and public property of every description, now in the armory or under the care of the armorer at Annapolis, and the Governor is authorised if necessary, to provide a place for their deposit and safe keeping.

Sec. 3. And be it enacted, That the said Adjutant General is hereby clothed with all the power and authority of the said armorers, and he is hereby required to perform the duties heretofore dis-

charged by them, under the existing laws of the State.
