Mr. Hamilton reported a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Thomas Baldwin of Prince George's county.

Mr. Newnam reported a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Edward J. Power of Kent county;

Mr. Staley reported a bill entitled, an act to authorise the sale of a school house in Frederick county;

Said bills severally read the first and by special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Powell,

The House took up the bill entitled, an act to regulate the compensation of jurors and witnesses in Worcester county;

Read the second time by special order, passed and sent to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Johns,

The House took up the bill entitled, an act to divorce Josephine Street Elworthy of the city of Annapolis, from her husband Richard James Hawke, a vinculo matrimonii;

Read the second time by special order, passed and sent to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Spencer,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Spencer, Hollman, Gove and Lyday, to bring in a bill to confirm and make valid certain bonds of the sheriff of Washington county, and to legalize the proceedings of John Carr as the sheriff of said county;

And to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, to bring in a bill relating to practice in the Court of Appeals.
