The committee on Claims, to whom was referred the petition of sundry creditors of the Eastern Shore Rail Road, have had the same under consideration, and beg leave to make the following

Whereas, a number of persons having claims against the Eastern Shore Rail Road Company for monies paid in as stock, and services rendred—all of a less amount than one hundred dollars, and the commissioner of loans is not authorised under the act passed at December session 1839, chapter 323, to issue stock of a less denomination than one hundred dollars. Therefore be it

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That he Treasurer of the Western Shore, be and he is hereby authorised to pay out of any unappropriated money in the treasury, the amount of money due to individuals as stockholders in the Eastern Shore Rail Road, or other claimants; provided the said claimants agree to take in cash, what the stock at present brings in the public market; and provided further, that each claim does not exceed one
