Mr. Sutton of Harford presented the petition of three hundred and eight citizens of Harford county, praying the passage of a law granting protection to float fisheries in the waters of the Chesapeake Bay above Spesutia Island to the head of tide water on the Susquehanna;

Read and referred to Messrs. Sutton of Harford, Johns, Hope and Bouldin.

Mr. Spencer reported a bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act for amending and reducing into system the laws and regulations concerning last wills and testament, the duties of executors, administrators and guardians, and the rights of orphans and other representatives of deceased persons, passed at Novem-ber session 1798, ch. 101;

Read the first and by special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.
