

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Adjutant General furnish to Captain J. B. Clunk of the Junior Artillerists of Baltimore, fifty muskets with the necessary accoutrements to match, in exchange for the same number of Carbines now in possession of said company, on condition that the said Captain J. B. Klunk give sufficient security for the safe keeping and return of the same, to the Adjutant General.

On motion of Mr. Traverse,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Traverse, Eccleston, Nicols of Dorchester and Richardson, to bring in a bill entitled, an act relating to constables in Dorchester county.

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act for the general valuation and assessment of property in this State, and to provide a tax to pay the debts of the State, passed at March session 1841, chapter 23,

Was sent to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Starr,

The House took up the bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to establish State warehouses for the inspection of tobacco in the city of Baltimore, passed December session 1823, chapter 165;

On motion of Mr. Owens of Anne Arundel,

Ordered, That the said bill be made the order of the day for tomorrow.

The House then took up the following bills:

The bill entitled, an act to redeem the scrip of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company;

On motion of Mr. Spencer,

Ordered, That the said bill be made the order of the day for this day week.

And the bill entitled, an act to abolish the office of armorer at Fredericktown and at the city of Annapolis;

Read the second time,

On motion of Mr. Tuck,

The house was called and the door-keeper sent after the absent members.

On motion of Mr. Randall,

The house proceeded with the ordinary business of the session in the absence of the doorkeeper.
