

Severally endorsed "will pass;"

Severally ordered to be engrossed.

And the bill entitled, an act for the relief John S. Selby, former sheriff of Anne Arundel county;

Endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendment;"

Amendment proposed:

After the words "sheriff as aforesaid provided" insert the following: "that the said John S. Selby shall in every case, before he proceeds to execute for any of said fees, make out a fair account thereof, with an affidavit annexed, that they are due, and that neither he nor any person for him, hath received any part of, or security for the same, and provided also;"

Which was read the first and by special order the second time, assented to, and the bill as amended ordered to be engrossed.

The rule being suspended,

Mr. Graves presented the memorial of the white male members of the Methodist Episcopal Church of Havre de Grace, counter to the twentieth proposition of the Slaveholders' Convention;

Read and referred to the committee on Colored Population.

The Speaker laid before the House a communication from the clerk of Baltimore county court, in obedience to the order of the House of the 2d instant;

Read the first time and laid on the table.

Mr. Johnson submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Adjutant General of Maryland be authorized to make a requisition on the General Government for two brass field pieces (six pounders) and fifty artillery swords, as a part of the State's quota of arms, for the Annapolis Artillerists, to be delivered to Captain M. C. Karney, or his successors, as he or they may demand;

Which was read the first and by special order the second time, assented to and sent to the Senate.

The House then took up the next order of the day, being the bill entitled, an act to complete the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal to Cumberland;

On motion of Mr. Carmichael,

Ordered, that the said bill be made the order of the day for Monday week.

On motion of Mr. Gallagher,

The house adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.
