So the said bill was passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Spencer presented the memorial of one hundred citizens of Washington county, remonstrating against changing the present pauper system of said county;

Leave was granted to the committee on the Militia, to bring in a bill to repeal the 51st section of the act passed December session 1823, entitled, an act for the better regulation of the militia

of the city of Baltimore.

Mr. Simmons, chairman of the committee on the Militia, to which were referred resolutions in favor of Captain William Small of the Frederick Light Infantry, of Captain Lambert D. Nowland of the Cecil Greys, of Captain John Thomas of the New Market Riflemen, of Captain Daniel Brengle of the Mohawk Riflemen, and of Captain George W. Sherwood of the Easton Guards, reported unfavorably thereon;

Which were read and laid on the table.
