

On being put, it was assented to and ordered to be engrossed.

On motion of Mr. Spencer,

The House took up the bill entitled, an additional supplement to an act entitled, an act directing the manner of suing out attachments in this province and limiting the extent of them;

The question being on the passage of the said bill as amended;

On motion of Mr. Spencer,

The said bill was reconsidered for the purpose of additional amendment.

On motion of Mr. Spencer,

The following amendments were read and assented to:

In the first section after the word "liable," in the 4th line, insert "for unliquidated damages."

In the same line strike out the word "for," and insert "upon."

In the 5th line same section after the word "or," insert the word "for."

And in the 5th line of the third section after the word "may," strike out to the end of the section, and insert "in his discretion order the sheriff upon ten days notice to sell the same and deposit the proceeds of sale with the clerk of the court, subject to the order of said court."

The question then recurred on the passage of the said bill as amended;

And on being put,

It was passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Darby reported a bill entitled, a further additional supplement to an act to provide for the repair of public roads in Montgomery county;

Read the first and by special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

The rule being suspended,

Mr. Carmichael presented the report of the trustees of the Churchhill Academy in Queen Anne's county;

And Mr. Brent presented the report of the Register of Wills for Charles county in relation to district schools in said county;

Severally read and referred to the committee on Education.

Beale H. Richardson, Esquire, a delegate returned from the city of Baltimore, to supply the vacancy occasioned by the resignation of John C. Le Grand, Esquire, appeared, qualified and took his seat.

Mr. Carmichael submitted the following order:

Ordered, That the clerk of this House have leave to employ an additional committee clerk for this House;

Which was read,

Mr. Duke then moved to amend said order by adding thereto the following, "and his per diem be paid by the present clerks."

Mr. Hammond then moved as a substitute for said amendment the following, "and that the chief clerk discharge such of the committee clerks as shall not faithfully discharge their duties as such;
