whose claims do not amount to the sum of one hundred dollars, out of the tolls received upon the said road from time to time, due regard being always had to the payment of the interest upon the bonds or certificates of debt hereby authorised to be issued.

Sec. 8. And be it enacted, That it shall be the duty of the president and directors of the Annapolis and Elk Ridge Rail Road Company, as soon as the situation of the company will admit, to have and keep in readiness, a sufficient number of cars for the transportation of all produce that may be brought to said road for that purpose; and for the greater convenience of the public, it shall be the duty of the said company, when its situation will permit, to establish such additional depots or switches on said road as may be required by the wants of the community and the public convenience.

Dec. 9. And be it enacted, That if any officer or agent, or other person employed by the said company, shall charge or receive any greater sum for the transportation of any article whatsoever, than is allowed by the provisions of the original charter, or any amendment thereto, such agent or other person so acting, shall be subjected to a fine of twenty dollars for every such offence, one half for the use of the informer, the other half to the State, to be collected as small debts are before a single magistrate.
