 title of said bill the following :

An act to prevent the further issue of irredeemable paper by any
 of the incorporated companies of this State.

Which was read.

On the question being put,

Will the House accept the said substitute?

It was determined in the negative.

On motion of Mr. Starr,

The House took up the unfavorable report of the committee on
 Divorces on the petition of Emilla Waters for a divorce from her
 husband William Waters ;

Read the second time by special order.

Mr. Starr then moved the following as a substitute for said un-
 favorable report :

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That
 Emilla Waters be and she is hereby divorced from her husband
 William Waters, a vinculo matrimonii ;

Ordered, That the said report and substitute be laid on the
 table.

 the Chesapeake and Ohio and Canal to Cumberland.

 tion of the said bill and substitute until Wednesday next ;
