

4. Resolved, That the Governor be and he is hereby requested to cause a copy of the foregoing resolutions, to be sent to each of the Senators and Representatives of this State in the Congress of the United States, to be laid before the two Houses of Congress.

Which were read.

On motion of Mr. Dennis,

Ordered, That the said resolutions be referred to the select committee to which were referred the resolutions of sundry citizens of Illinois, upon the subject of our relations with Great Britain and the necessity of providing for our national defence.

On motion of Mr. Dennis,

Ordered, That the said select committee be enlarged by adding thereto Messrs. Dennis, Sellman, Graves and Tuck.

On motion of Mr. Graves,

Ordered, That resolution No. 18, December session 1840, be referred to the same committee.

On motion of Mr. Hammond,

Leave was granted to withdraw from the files of the House, a petition in relation to a bridge at Triadelphia Factory.

On motion of Mr. Hammond,

Leave granted to Messrs. Hammond, Gittings, Darby, Sellman, Dorsey, Braddock, Owens of Anne Arundel and Gott, to bring in a bill entitled, an act to make a bridge at Triadelphia Factory, and to lay out and make a road in Montgomery county.

On motion of Mr. Spencer,

Leave was granted to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, to bring in a bill entitled, an additional supplement to an act entitled, an act for quieting possessions, enrolling conveyances and securing the estates of purchasers.

Mr. Gallagher, chairman of the committee on Corporations, reported a bill entitled, an act to incorporate the William Wirt Beneficial Society of Baltimore;

Read the first time and laid on the table.

Also, as chairman of the same committee to which was recommitted the bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Mount Orange Cemetery in the county of Baltimore, reported favorably thereon;

Read the second time by special order.

On motion of Mr. Risteau,

The following amendment was read and assented to:

Strike out all after the word "execution," in the 3rd line of the sixth section to the end of said section.

Mr. Gallagher then moved to amend said bill by adding as an additional section the following:

Section 10. And be it enacted, That the Legislature reserves to itself the right to change, alter or amend this act of incorporation at pleasure.
