

It was determined in the negative.

The question then recurred on the passage of the said bill;

And on being put,

It was passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Carmichael, chairman of the committee on Ways and Means, to which was referred the bill from the Senate entitled, an act relating to the collectors of the public revenue, passed at December session 1825, chapter 216, reported unfavorably thereon;

Read the first time and laid on the table.

Also, reported that the said committee had instructed him to ask to be discharged from the further consideration of the bill entitled, an act to repeal all existing laws and resolutions enacted by this State, allowing per centage commissions and other perquisites to the salaries of officers of this State.

Which was read and concurred in.

On motion of Mr. Carmichael,

Ordered, That said bill be recommended to the committee on Retrenchment.

Also, asked to be discharged from the consideration of the bill from the Senate entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to provide for the destruction of wolves, panthers and foxes in Allegany county, passed at December session 1840, ch. 56;

Which was read and concurred in.

On motion of Mr. Carmichael,

Ordered, That said bill be referred to Messrs. Buskirk, Buchanan and Shaw.

And reported favorably on the bill entitled, an act to repeal the first section of an act to compensate the Adjutant General of this State;

Read the first time and laid on the table.

And asked to be discharged from the consideration of the bill from the Senate entitled, an act to prevent excessive wharfage in the city of Baltimore;

Which was read and concurred in.

On motion of Mr. Carmichael,

Ordered, That said bill be referred to the committee on Agriculture.

And unfavorably on the bill entitled, an act to fix the per diem of the members of the Legislature and the several officers thereof, of this State;

Read the first time and laid on the table.

And unfavorably on the petition of James D. Woodside of the District of Columbia, praying the Legislature to remunerate him for services rendered to the State in elevating the statue of Washington upon the Monument at Baltimore;

Read the first time and laid on the table.

And asked to be discharged from the consideration of two several petitions of eighty-seven and ninety-three citizens of Saint Michael's district in Talbot county, praying the passage of a law prohibiting the sale of intoxicating liquors in said district, if a majority
