Mr. Graves then moved the following as a substitute for said bill and amendment:

“Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the clerical duties of Adjutant General as now performed by him shall hereafter be performed by the Secretary of State, and that all other duties pertaining to the office of Adjutant General shall be performed hereafter by the armorer at Annapolis.

“And be it enacted, That the salary of the Adjutant General is hereby abolished, and the salary of the armorer at Annapolis shall be five hundred dollars.

“And be it enacted, That nothing in this act shall be construed to confer a military rank upon either of the aforesaid officers.”

Which was read.
