The said amendment was amended by adding thereto the following:

“And that the salary of the armorer at Easton, shall be one hundred and fifty dollars per annum;”

Mr. Spencer then moved to amend said bill by striking out the second section and inserting the following in lieu thereof:

Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That during peace the Adjutant General shall receive no compensation, and during war he shall receive five hundred dollars annually, and that during any vacancy in the office of Adjutant General, the clerical duties of said Adjutant General shall be performed by the Secretary of State, and all other duties of said officer during said vacancy shall be performed by the armorer at Annapolis.
