The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Maccubbin presented the petition of George W. Biscoe and sundry other citizens of Prince George's county, praying that magistrates' courts may be re-established in said county;

Read and referred to Messrs. Maccubbin, Hamilton, Tuck and Bayne.

Mr. Morsell presented the petition of sundry citizens of the third election district in Calvert county, in regard to the school fund of said district;

Read and referred to the committee on Education.

Mr. Hope presented the petition of one hundred and eighty citizens of Marshall's district of Harford county, praying the Senate to concur in the bill that passed the House of Delegates to compel the banks to resume specie payments within twenty days after the passage of said bill;

Read and referred to consideration of the Senate.

Mr. Owens of Anne Arundel presented the memorial of the citizens of Friendship and surrounding neighborhood in Anne Arundel county, in relation to pedlars;
