Howard, a citizen of Maryland, and others, citizens of other States, accompanied said expedition, and it is the duty of the government of the United States to extend to its citizens under all circumstances such relief and protection as it is within its competency to grant—Therefore,

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That His Excellency the President of the United States, be requested to use such means as the constitution of the United States, and the public law of nations may authorise, for ameliorating the condition of the persons captured as aforesaid, and especially for the purpose of protecting and demanding such citizens of the United States, as may have accompanied said expedition.

Resolved, That His Excellency the Governor, be requested to cause a copy of the foregoing preamble and resolutions, to be forwarded to the President of the United States, and also to each of our Senators and Representatives in Congress.
