The state of the treasury at this time, it is believed, will not warrant its passage; the passage of it would in all probability cause applications to be made by other creditors, who might with reason insist that they ought to be paid in the same way; and just at this time it would be difficult to ascertain "what the stock at present brings in the public market."

If your honorable body shall think proper to adopt a resolution authorizing certificates to be issued to the several creditors and others, for whose relief this resolution was passed, in the same manner as if their claims exceeded one hundred dollars, the Se-
