

Read and referred to the committee on Pensions and Revolutionary Claims.

On motion of Mr. Matthews,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Matthews, Brent and Crain, to bring in a bill to be entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act for the speedy recovery of small debts out of court, and to repeal the acts of Assembly therein mentioned.

On motion of Mr. Richardson of Baltimore,

Leave was granted to the committee on Corporations, to bring in a bill to incorporate the Maryland Lyceum ;

And to bring in a bill to incorporate the Temperance Savings Institution.

On motion of Mr. Sutton of Kent,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Sutton of Kent, J. H. Gale and R. M. Gale, to bring in a bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act for the improvement of the public roads in Kent county, passed at November session 1800, ch. 58, and to repeal the act entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act for the improvement of the public roads in Kent county, passed at December session 1837, ch. 170.

On motion of Mr. Schley,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Schley, Geyer, Simmons and Staley, to bring in a bill relating to sheriffs.

Mr. Gallagher submitted the following resolutions :

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That John Waring, inspector at tobacco warehouse No. 1, in the city of Baltimore, be and he is hereby authorised to contract for such repairs as may be necessary to put the said warehouse in complete repair.

Resolved, That the Treasurer of the Western shore be, and he is hereby required to pay, out of any moneys to the credit of the tobacco inspection fund unappropriated, to the Governor or his order, such sum or sums from time to time, as may be necessary to carry into effect the foregoing resolution; provided, that no larger sum than fourteen hundred dollars be required to complete the repairs of said warehouse.

Resolved, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby directed to pay the sum of nine hundred dollars, out of the tobacco inspection fund, to the Governor or his order, to be appropriated to the repair of tobacco warehouse No. 3, in the city of Baltimore; the said repairs to be made under the direction of Nicholas Dorsey, inspector at said warehouse.

Which were read and laid on the table.

On motion of Mr. Boyle,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Boyle, Stull, Davis and Powder, to bring in a bill to authorise the trustees of the Catholic Church of Taneytown in Carroll county, to hold certain property.

On motion of Mr. Spencer,
