So the enacting clause of said bill was stricken out.

Mr. Schley reported a bill entitled, an act relating to sheriffs;

Read the first time and laid on the table.

The House then took up the bill entitled, an act to raise additional revenue to aid in paying the debts of the State, being the unfinished business of yesterday.

Mr. Owens of Anne Arundel then moved to amend said bill by striking out the second section and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

“And be it enacted, That all salaries, incomes, emoluments and profits made taxable by the first section of this act, shall be taxed at the rate of two and a half per cent.; provided that nothing contained herein shall authorize the levying of any tax upon any salary, income, emolument or profit, the annual value of which does not amount to or exceed five hundred dollars.”

Which was read.

Mr. Causin then moved as a substitute for the said amendment the following:

Strike out all after the word “shall” in the 2d line of the 2d section and insert “to be taxed at the rate of tax provided by the act of March session 1841, ch. 23, or to be provided for by any supplement thereto.”

Which was read.
