

ern Shore, or which may be in any wise inconsistent with the provisions of this act, be and the same are hereby repealed.

Sec. 6. And be it enacted, That if this act shall be concurred in and approved of by the next General Assembly of this State, the same shall be deemed and taken as a part of the constitution and form of government of this State, any thing to the contrary notwithstanding.

Which was read.

Mr. Sherwood then moved to lay the said bill and amendments on the table, and that the same be printed;

Determined in the negative.

The question then recurred on assenting to the amendment, And on being put,

It was determined in the affirmative.

Mr. Cathell then moved to amend the said bill by adding as an additional section the following:

“And be it enacted, That the citizens of the Eastern Shore, shall be and they are hereby authorized to secede from the Western Shore, when a majority of the voters thereof shall express their wish so to do.”

Which was read.

Mr. Presstman then moved to reject the said amendment;
