Strike out the 21st section of the bill.

On motion of Mr. Crain,

The following amendments were read and assented to :

Strike out in the 6th line of the 21st section the words "one hundred" and insert "fifty."

And strike out "fifty" in the 8th line and insert "twenty-five."

On motion of Mr. Hammond,

The vote on refusing to strike out the 21st section was reconsidered.

On motion of Mr. Hammond,

The 21st section of said bill was then stricken out.

On motion of Mr. Morsell,

The following amendments were read and assented to :

Insert after the word "nothing" in the first line of the 35th section the word "herein."

Strike out the words "in the first section on this act" in the first and second lines of the 35th section, and strike out the words "said section" in the 3rd line of the same section and insert "the first section of this act."

Mr. Johns then moved to reconsider the 10th section of the bill for the purpose of amendment ;

Determined in the negative.

The question then recurred on the passage of the said bill as amended.
