The question recurred on the passage of the said bill;

It was passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Spencer then moved to suspend the rule to take up the bill entitled, an act to redeem the scrip of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company;

Mr. Sutton of Harford reported a bill entitled, an act to protect the rights of floating batteries at the head of Chesapeake bay;

Mr. Hollman, chairman of the committee on Claims, made the following

REPORT:

The committee on Claims to which was referred the resolution of the House of Delegates of the 21st of January last, in favor of John T. Edwards, who furnished provisions to the troops engaged in suppressing riots on the line of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal, in September eighteen hundred and thirty-nine, and whose account was omitted in the resolution in favor of paying all other persons who furnished provisions to said troops, in the same expedition, passed at December session 1839, beg leave to report favorably thereon; and recommend the adoption of the following resolution—therefore,

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to the said John T. Edwards sixty-five dollars, being the amount of his claim, for provisions furnished to the troops engaged in suppressing the said riots in September eighteen hundred thirty-nine.
