Mr. Johnson presented the memorial of Charles Oliver of the city of Baltimore ;

Read and referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.

On motion of Mr. Brent,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Brent, Matthews and Crain, to bring in a bill entitled, a further supplement to an act entitled, an act to establish magistrates' courts in the several counties of this State, so far as relates to Charles county.

The bill entitled, an act for the better security of negro slaves in this State, and for promoting industry and honesty amongst the free people of color ;

The House then took up the bill entitled, an act to provide for taking the vote of the people of this State, as to the expediency of calling a convention to reform the present and frame a new constitution, and to amend the constitution so as to enable the Legislature to call such a convention ;
