Mr. Geyer submitted the following preamble and resolution:

Whereas, It appears by the certificate of the Register of the Land Office, that James Ervine was a soldier of the "Maryland Line" in the war of the Revolution up to the time of the disbandment of the army November 15, 1783: and whereas, the said James Ervine never received a pension in consideration of his services—therefore,

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore be and he is hereby authorized to pay to Samuel Ervine, one of the heirs of James Ervine, a soldier of the "Maryland Line," to be equally divided among all the heirs of the said Ervine, the half-pay of a private from the date above mentioned to the period of his, the said James Ervine's, death.

Which was read the first and by special order the second time; On motion of Mr. Johnson,

Ordered, That the same be referred to the committee on Pensions and Revolutionary Claims.

Mr. Buskirk submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the commissioner of loans of this State be and he is hereby authorized and directed, immediately to issue and deliver to Thomas Robertson, Sr., of Somerset county, a certificate of debt, of the State of Maryland, to the amount of five hundred and eighty dollars, bearing an interest of five per centum per annum, payable semi-
