amount due Sarah Wyndham for pension, per resolution No. 42, of 1821, to the 5th day of August 1841, the day of her death.

Which was read, assented to and sent to the Senate.

And reported unfavorably on the petition of Lydia Brown, praying that she may be allowed a pension in consideration of the services of her father Richard Hill, a soldier of the revolution;

And on the memorial of Mary Allen of the city of Baltimore,

praying for a pension;

Severally read the first time and laid on the table.

Mr. Johnson, from the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, to which was referred the bill from the Senate entitled, an act to empower the county court of Queen Anne's county, to divide the real estate therein mentioned, reported the same without amendment;

Read and laid on the table.

Mr. Hollman, chairman of the committee on Claims, made the following

REPORT:

The committee on claims, to which was referred the petition of I. Nevitt Steele, have had the same under consideration, and beg leave to report favorably thereon; and also recommend the adop-

tion of the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Governor be, and he is hereby authorised to make such reasonable compensation, to be paid upon his requisition, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury, to I. Nevitt Steele, Deputy of the Attorney General, for the argument of the cases coming up to the December Term 1841, of the Court of Appeals, under the act of Assembly, passed at April session 1841, ch. 23, as to him may seem just and proper, in lieu of the legal fees taxed in said causes.

All which is respectfully submitted, JOSEPH HOLLMAN, Chairman.

Which was read, assented to and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Brent, from the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, reported a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Sarah E. Mitchell;

Read the first and by special order the second time, passed and

sent to the Senate.

Mr. Boyle submitted the following message:

By the House of Delegates, March 1st, 1842.

Gentlemen of the Senate:

We herewith return you the bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to establish magistrates' courts in the several counties of this State, and to prescribe their jurisdiction, passed at December session 1835, ch. 201, and respectfully ask your honorable body to reconsider and pass the same.
