Which was read.

On the question being put,

Will the House accept the said substitute?

It was determined in the affirmative.

The question then recurred on the passage of the said bill,

And on being put,

It was passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Presstman submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Adjutant General of this State furnish to Lieutenant P. W. Lowry, Lieut. Commanding the National Guards of the city of Baltimore, fifty white glazed leather body belts, fifty black glazed leather cartridge boxes and fifty bayonet scabbards, on the condition that the said Lieutenant P. W. Lowry will give security for the return of the same;

Which was read, assented to and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Johns, chairman of the committee on Divorces, to which was referred the petition of Hopeful Toler of Prince George's county, praying to be divorced from his wife Ann Nicholas Toler, reported that the prayer of the said petitioner ought not to be granted;

Read the first and by special order the second time;

Mr. Risteau then moved the following as a substitute for said report:

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Hopeful Toler, be and he is hereby divorced from his wife Ann Nicholas Toler, a vinculo matrimonii.

Which was read;

On the question being put,

Will the House accept the said substitute?

It was determined in the affirmative.

The question then recurred on the passage of the said bill,

And on being put,

It was passed and sent to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Johnson,

The House took up the bill from the Senate entitled, an act to empower the county court of Queen Anne's county, to divide the real estate therein mentioned;

Read the second time by special order, passed and returned to the Senate.
