

By the House of Delegates,

March 1st, 1842.

Gentlemen of the Senate:

We received your message of the 25th ultimo, proposing to proceed to the election of bank directors, on the part of the State, at one o'clock—at the time your message was received the House of Delegates had under consideration the bill concerning the Annapolis and Elkridge Rail Road Company—and continued therein until just before its adjournment. The message was not read until after the hour named therein had expired—of course the House was uninformed as to its purport. We concur in the proposition to go into an election of bank directors, and in lieu of the day named in your message propose the 3rd instant, at 12 o'clock.

We have nominated on the part of this House:

For the Mechanics' Bank—James Wilson of Howard street and Samuel Lucas.

For the Farmers' Bank of Maryland—Robert Welch of Ben., Thomas Snowden and Horatio C. Scott.

For the Branch Bank of the same at Easton—James Price, James Lloyd Martin of Talbot, and Thomas White of Dorchester.

For the Elkton Bank—Adam Whann.

For the Hagerstown Bank—George Sprecher and Frederick Bell.

Which was read, assented to and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Richardson of Baltimore presented the petition of sundry citizens of Fell's Point, Baltimore, praying an act of incorporation for the purposes therein mentioned;

Read and referred to the committee on Corporations.

On motion of Mr. Sutton of St. Mary's,

Leave was granted to withdraw from the files of this House, the petition of Edward Paul Plater.

Mr. Sutton of St. Mary's submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to James D. Sutton, for the use of Edward Paul Plowder, the sum of \$57 with interest thereon from the 12th day of May 1816, it being a balance due said Plowder, for a horse lost in the service of the State, during the late war.

Which was read the first and by special order the second time,

On motion of Mr. Owens of Anne Arundel,

Ordered, That said resolution be referred to the committee on Claims.

On motion of Mr. Schley,

The House took up the bill from the Senate entitled, an act to authorize and require the Court of Appeals for the Western Shore of Maryland, at the June term 1842 of the said court, to take up, hear, try and determine a case in said court now depending between Henry Repp, sen., Daniel Repp and others, appellants and
