Henry Repp, jun., Surat D. Warfield and Jacob Fox, appellees; Read the second time by special order, passed and returned to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Johnson,

The House took up the bill entitled, a further supplement to the act enlarging the powers of the High Court of Chancery;

Read the second time by special order, passed and sent to the

Senate.

On motion of Mr. Richardson of Baltimore,

Ordered, That the President and Directors of the Susquehanna and Tide Water Canal Company be, and they are hereby required, to make a full and correct report of their condition; stating their assetts and liabilities—whether assignments have been made, and if so, to whom, and on what conditions—whether the interest of the State has been secured, and when it will be paid, with such other information as may be necessary to a full understanding of the actual situation of said company; said report to be made to the Governor of Maryland within sixty days after the passage of this order, and by him made public for the information of all concerned.

Ordered further, That the Governor be required on failure of the said company to report as aforesaid, to direct the Attorney General to issue a scire facias against the said company, requiring them to shew cause why their charter should not be forfeited.

Mr. Dorsey, chairman of the committee on Agriculture, to which was referred the bill from the Senate entitled, an act to prevent the collection of excessive wharfage in the city of Baltimore, reported the same without amendment;
