Mr. Buchanan, from the select committee on public printing, made the following

REPORT:

The committee on public printing, to whom was referred the order of the House of the 29th ultimo, beg leave to report in part:

That they have had under consideration that part of said order, which directed the committee to "ascertain whether any contract has been entered into for the printing of the present House of Delegates, and if any, whether said contract is in accordance with law."

In examining the subject, the committee have ascertained that there is in existence what purports to be a contract for the printing of the present session, made by the joint committee on printing of the last Legislature, with Jeremiah Hughes, as appears by

the journal of the extra session, April 6th, 1841.

The committee do not deem it necessary to enter into any argument to show whether the act of Assembly of 1831, ch. 303, was repealed by the proceedings of the two Houses of the Legisgislature, on the 20th March, 1840, or not. Nor do they deem it necessary to express an opinion whether one Legislature has a right to enter into a contract which shall be binding on a subsequent body, yet to be elected by the people.
