Severally read the first time and laid on the table.

And the bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from Middletown, in Frederick county, to the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal, at some point thereon in the Catoctin Valley, between the Catoctin and Blue Ridge mountains;

Severally read the first time and laid on the table.

Mr. Sherwood, from the committee on Inspections, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to regulate the inspection of red oak staves and heading in this State, reported the same without amendment;

Read the second time by special order.

On motion of Mr. Schley,

The following amendment was read and assented to:

“And be it enacted, That the provisions of this bill include all staves and heading.”

It was passed and sent to the Senate.
